- PBiS Parent Information- Thank you to all the families that were able to attend the PBIS parent meetings that were held on Monday, August 24th. For those that were unable to attend, I presented to parents about the PBiS behavioral model that has now been implemented at O'Neill Elementary. This program is based on setting clear expectations for our students, teaching those expectations and recognizing our students when they meet or exceed those expectations. I also explained a change in the mindset of discipline at the school. I strongly encourage all parents to take the time to view the parent presentation online if you were unable to attend the meeting.
- Tardy Policy- The O'Neill Public School Tardy Policy has changed. We want to make families aware that this policy has been revised as to if a student receives 3 unexcused tardies (as determined by the attendance monitor) will serve a 1 hour after school time to make up for that missed instructional time. A student is considered Tardy if they arrive at school after 8:00 am on a regular instructional day. We appreciate the partnership of our families with us in making sure our students are here and ready to learn so that they do not miss any valuable instruction.
